Enclosed please find offer of donation of parking lots to the City of Rockingham by J. Neal Cadieu to be used for parking/increased access to DPK-Rockingham. This is a very generous offer by Mr. Cadieu and will greatly benefit DPK-Rockingham. If Council authorizes the acceptance of this gift, the City Attorney will conduct a title search and proceed with transfer of property to City of Rockingham.

Enclosed please find a copy of the City's Land Use Plan adopted in July, 2002 and Civic Index which was adopted in October, 2004. As we approached the end of last year (2011), John and I reviewed both the Land Use Plan and Civic Index. As we start a New Year and based on the lifespan of the Land Use Plan and Civic Index, it appears to be a good time to revisit and update the City's goals and objectives and how they can be accomplished over the next decade. In reviewing both the Land Use Plan and Civic Index, a lot has been accomplished and the same was true for the prior plans (pre-2002/2004). I believe both have been extremely useful and helpful in moving both the City and County forward. I also believe reviewing and updating both plans would prove valuable in

determining our community priorities based on including fresh citizen input. Clearly, in viewing both plans, there have been successes that have led to community improvements but there are still crucial issues that need to be addressed. Having an updated community plan and vision will provide a road map and direction to continue to address community needs over the next decade. Staff will look forward to receiving Mayor and Council's directive on how you want to proceed.

ITEMS OF INTEREST:

1. The City received its second and final distribution of Powell Bill funds for FY 2011/12 on 12/21/11 in the amount of \$135,518.46. Based on October 1, 2011 distribution of \$135,518.31 the total Powell Bill distribution for 2011/12 will be \$271,036.77 which exceeds budget projection by \$5,515.77. Now that City has confirmed its Powell Bill distribution for current year, staff will be evaluating proceeding with street/sidewalk rehab in the Scales/Ledbetter Street area.
2. The City has recently received executed NCDOT Enhancement Agreement for Franklin Street Revitalization Project for landscaping (trees, planters). The City will be going out to bid on this project within the next 30-60 days.
3. The City in conjunction with our architect WHN and Discovery Place are currently pre-qualifying contractors for the DPK-Rockingham construction phase. It is the intent of all parties to go to bid with this project as soon as possible.
4. The annual update of the City's Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) is scheduled to be completed by staff by mid-March. The CIP is used to effectively manage acquisition of City's capital needs and is a useful tool to be used in conjunction with new budget (FY 12/13). The CIP will cover FY12/13 - FY16/17.

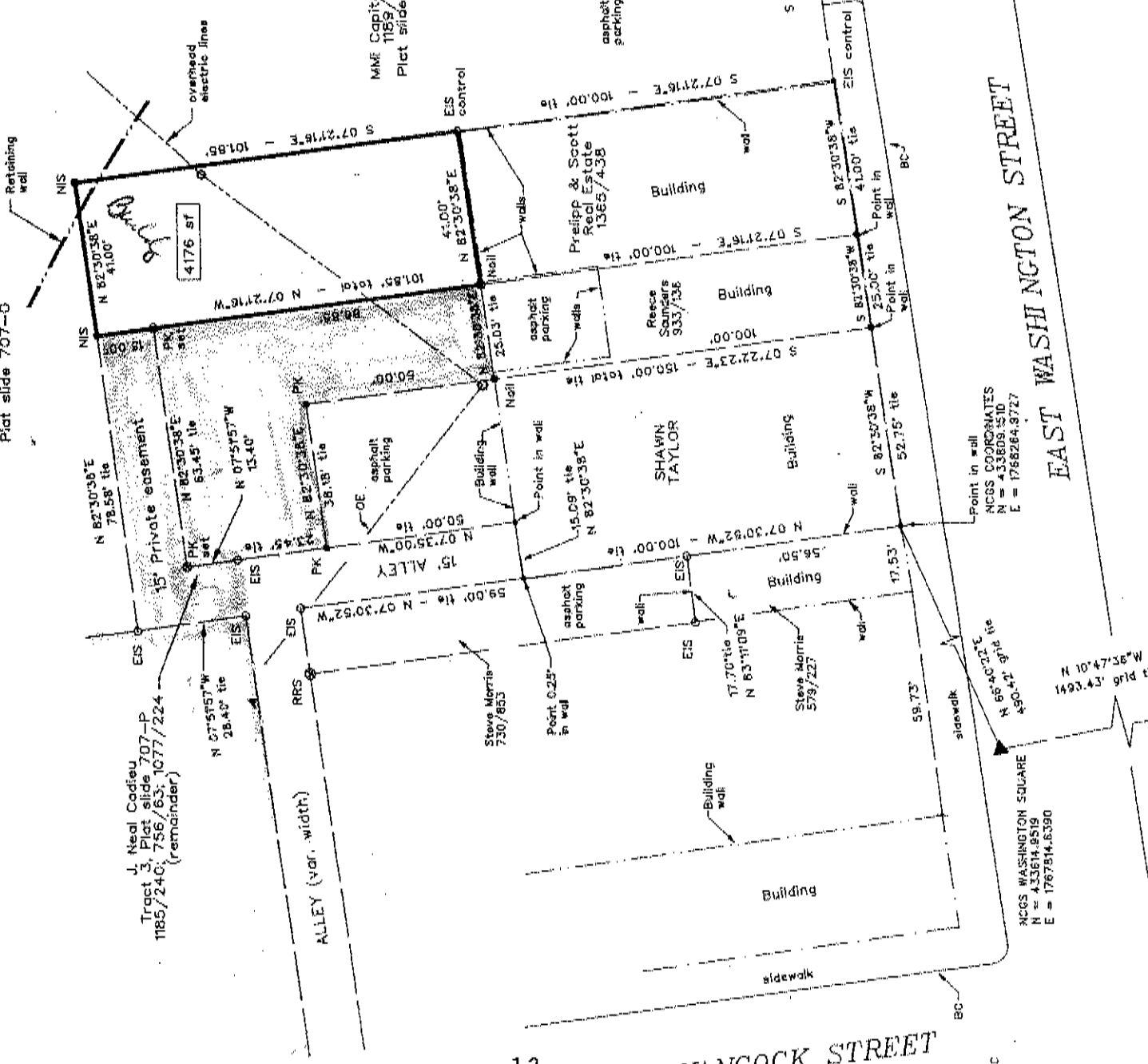
LOCATION MAP

Re: Update for Shaping Our Future: 2012, the City's Land Use Plan

The City's current land use plan, *Shaping Our Future: 2012*, is set to expire this year. As some of you may recall, the current plan was adopted in July of 2002. The plan has served as the guide for most all land use related decisions and many special projects over the last ten-year period. The City has made significant progress in accomplishing many of the objectives set forth in the plan. In the opinion of City staff, all of the goals and many of the objectives originally identified in the plan are still applicable; however the plan does need to be updated. So during the 2012 calendar year, City staff will commence the process of updating the City's land use plan – *Shaping Our Future: 2012*.

Those of you that were involved in the preparation of the original plan know that this is a somewhat lengthy and time-consuming process. The City Council will need to appoint a steering committee to oversee the process. City staff will collect and analyze demographic data/trends (population, economic, and housing) as well as other variables that influence growth and development patterns (ie. environmental constraints, public infrastructure, and existing land use patterns, etc.). Citizen input is a critical component in the planning process; thus citizen surveys will be conducted and citizen input sessions will be held. The steering committee will use the data collected and citizen input to revise and update the goals and objectives.

PROCLAMATION

Honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Eugene B. McLaurin, II, Mayor and the Members of the Rockingham City Council do hereby resolve that Monday January 16, 2012 be set aside as a day to remember Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and to promote appropriate activities to further enhance the democratic ideals and concepts advanced by this great American.
